This order shall dispose of above-mentioned two petitions
filed on behalf of petitioners-Karam Singh alias Karma, Gurmeet Singh,
Gurpreet Singh, Satnam Singh alias Manga, Ajit Singh alias Jita,
Mandeep Singh alias Goldy and Sarwan in **CRM-M-23701-2018** and

petitioner-Bittu in **CRM-M-25483-2018** seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.84 dated 10.05.2018 under Sections 379, 353, 186, 332, 323 and 324 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, Police Station Government Railway Police, GRP Amritsar.

The FIR was lodged at the instance of C. Mukhtar Singh, R.P.F., wherein it is alleged that on 09.05.2018 while he was deputed at the railway yard, Railway Station, Chhehrata, he noticed two persons riding a white coloured Activa scooter carrying three bags of wheat and when he confronted them on suspicion asking them about the bags carried by them, they scuffled with him as well as with his companion C. Navtej Singh and that they gave beatings to them with the help of their other accomplices namely Gurpreet Singh Manga, Karma, Jeeta, Goldy and Sarwan. It has been stated therein that he knows the persons who were riding the activa scooter and that one of them is Gurmeet Singh, who was riding the activa and other is Bittu, who was pillion rider.

Notice of petitions was issued to the State .

The petitioners were directed to join investigation.

Today at the very outset learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Bhupinder Singh has stated that all the petitioners have since joined investigation and are no longer required for the purpose of custodial interrogation.

Bearing in mind the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that the petitioners are no longer required for interrogation or investigation, the petitions are accepted and interim directions issued vide order dated 30.05.2018 passed in **CRM-M-23701-2018** and order dated 08.06.2018 passed in **CRM-M-25483-2018** are made absolute subject to the

condition that the petitioners would appear before the learned trial Court regularly and abide by the any other condition as may be imposed by the learned trial Court.

The petitions are accepted in the abovementioned terms.
