This order shall dispose of CRM-M-23875-2018, filed by
petitioner-Kashmir Singh and CRM-M-30916-2018, filed by petitioner-
Gurjinder Singh @ Tony, under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal

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Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.17 dated 14.02.2018, registered at Police Station Phase-8, SAS Nagar, District SAS Nagar, Mohali, under Sections 406, 419, 420, 465, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued in both these petitions. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

As per the version of complainant, an amount of ₹60 lakhs was paid to petitioner-Gurjinder Singh @ Tony, who has shown the land as his own alongwith others and entered into an agreement to sell with the complainant. The allegation against petitioner-Kashmir Singh is that he impersonated himself as Bahadur Singh.

Challan has already been presented. The petitioners have been in custody since 15.02.2018. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping them in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, both these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of

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₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of
the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
