**AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)**

Petitioner has approached this Court alleging that her life and liberty is at threat at the hands of respondent No.3-Dr. Guninder Singh, her son, who is working as a Medical Officer in the Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur.

It is contended that the petitioner is a senior citizen aged more than 75 years and is suffering from various old age related ailments. In support thereof, the Aadhaar Card and the medical treatment record have been appended as Annexures P-1 and P-2 (colly.) which highlights the actual physical medical status of the petitioner indicating various sorts of ailments which she had been suffering or had suffered. It is alleged that the petitioner is residing in her house and respondent No.3 has been creating problems for her by not even permitting medical help as and when required. Counsel further contends that she had been approaching the authorities with these grievances but nothing is coming out therefrom. A suit for possession has also been preferred by the petitioner against respondent No.3 regarding land measuring 138 kanals 11-5/6 marlas and the transfer deed dated 30.11.2016 registered as Wasika No.2605 with Sub Registrar, Khanna, District Ludhiana, and mutation bearing No.16352 on the basis of the

transfer deed also stand challenged apart from recovery of ₹10 lakh on account of mesne profits, which is pending consideration of the Court. One of the representations which have been submitted by the petitioner is dated 21.03.2018 (Annexure P-7) to the Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana, highlighting therein the grievance of the petitioner.

Keeping in view the above assertions of the petitioner, a direction is issued to the Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana-respondent No.2 to look into the representation of the petitioner and if some substance is found therein, take appropriate steps in accordance with law.

The petition stands disposed of accordingly.
