This petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No. 91 dated 17.11.2015, registered under Sections 498-A and 406 of the Indian Penal Code at Women Police Station, Amritsar (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

This petition came up for hearing on 21.07.2016, on which date, it was ordered that notice be issued to respondent No. 2 for 21.10.2016, subject to deposit of ₹25,000/- as litigation expenses by the petitioners. However, notice could not be issued to respondent No. 2 since the petitioners did not deposit the said litigation expenses. On 21.10.2016, the petitioners were granted one more opportunity to do the needful but the situation remained the same. On 22.02.2017, the petitioners were granted last opportunity to deposit the litigation expenses but again they did not do the same. On 07.07.2017, the matter was taken up for hearing and it was ordered that if the needful is not done within a period of three weeks from

that day, this petition would be deemed to have been dismissed.

Today, the matter has been taken up for hearing. There is no representation on behalf of the petitioner. As per office report, litigation expenses have not yet been deposited. It seems that the petitioners are not interested to pursue this petition.

In view of above, the present petition is dismissed in default.
