Pursuant to the order of this Court dated 09.01.2018, the petitioner and the complainant are stated to have appeared before the learned Mediator of the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court but with no settlement arrived at between the parties.

The allegation against the petitioner being that he had stolen cheques from the complainants' (his fathers') cheque book, they admittedly having resided together at that time, and misused them, with the father stated to be suffering from cancer, though learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner submits that as a matter of fact the cheques were issued in terms of an oral settlement reached between the parties with regard to the division of the business, no such written agreement having been produced in Court, in the circumstances that the allegation is by an ailing father as stated above, I do not think this is an appropriate case where the interim order in favour of the petitioner should continue.

Consequently, this petition is dismissed and the order of this Court dated 09.01.2018, admitting the petitioner to interim bail, is vacated.

However, nothing observed by this Court earlier hereinabove or in the previous order, would be taken to be an observation on the merits of the case for or against the petitioner, which would be gone into by the investigating agency and the competent Court at the relevant time, all observations having been made in the context of the petition seeking anticipatory bail for the petitioner.
