Petitioner-Sukhraj Singh @ Sukha has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.17 dated 12.04.2017, registered at Police Station Kanwan, District Pathankot, under Sections 379-B, 420, 467, 468 and 471 of IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion was issued. Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the FIR, when complainant-Happy was going on a motor-cycle, three Hindu gentlemen,

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who were on another motor-cycle, came near him and took out the key of his motor-cycle. Thereafter, by pointing out a weapon like *kirach*, they took away ₹950/-, mobile phone and motor-cycle of the complainant.

It has also been brought into notice of this Court that co-accused from whom the motor-cycle was recovered, has been given the benefit of anticipatory bail by the Coordinate Bench of this Court.

The petitioner has been in custody since 11.05.2017. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
