Present petition has been filed for seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 51 dated 11.05.2018 for the offences punishable under Section 406, 420 IPC registered at Police Station Phase-11, District SAS Nagar, Mohali, Punjab.

The allegation contained in the FIR are quite specific to the effect that the petitioner had received an amount of Rs.3.5 lakhs from the complainant for ensuring a job to his son.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that the complaint is false and created at the instance of Harjinder Singh who has also filed a separate similar complaint. Learned counsel further submits that son of the complainant was granted job also as promised by the petitioner. However, he had left that job because the company itself was closed after two months.

In view of the above fact, it almost stands admitted by the complainant that he was indulging in ensuring job to the petitioner's son and may be other persons also in the similar manner. There is specific allegation against the petitioner that he has received Rs.3.5 lakhs and that

amount has not been returned by him. The allegation against the petitioner is quite serious which involves cheating. Therefore, the prayer to extend the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner is declined.
