MANOJ BAJAJ, J.

Mangal Singh has filed this petition seeking pre-arrest bail in case FIR No.48 dated 11.05.2018 under Sections 452, 323 and 324 read with Section 34 of Indian Penal Code (in short 'IPC') (Sections 325, 326 and 458 IPC added later on) registered at Police Station Hariana, District Hoshiarpur on the basis of complaint given by Harmesh Singh. The occurrence took place on 10.05.2018 whereby the accused/petitioner-Mangal Singh along with unknown persons had entered the house of the victim and caused multiple injuries.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has joined the investigation and the injuries are not caused by any sharp edge weapon. While the counsel for the complainant has contended that as a

result of all these injuries, complainant was admitted to the hospital and was operated twice. The discharge summary issued by Capitol Hospital indicates the date of admission as 11.05.2018 and date of discharge as 17.05.2018.

Learned State counsel has also opposed the petition for bail on the ground that the custodial interrogation of the petitioner is necessary as the other three unknown persons/assailants are yet to be identified.

Considering the gravity of the offence and the stage of the investigation, no case for grant of anticipatory bail is made out.

Consequently, the petition stands dismissed.
