Petitioner-Avinash Kumar @ Pinchu has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.105 dated 15.08.2017, registered at Police Station Lehra, District Sangrur, under Sections 307, 341, 323, 325 (added later on), 506 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that the present petitioner is named in the FIR and stated to be armed with spade. The injury dangerous to life has not been attributed to him. Injury No.1 on the head of

complainant is attributed to the present petitioner which is simple one with blunt weapon.

As per learned State counsel, the petitioner has caused injury No.5 to one Mithu Ram, but in the FIR, it is not so stated. However, another injury attributed to the present petitioner is on the right side of back of complainant.

The petitioner has been in custody since 11.04.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping him in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
