In the present petition, petitioner has prayed for the following relief:-

"Petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure praying for quashing of the complaint case No. COMI No. 249/2006 (Annexure P/1) dated 08.08.2006 for offences punishable under Sections 420, 465, 466, 467, 468, 471 and 474/34 of the Indian Penal Code and the order dated 19.02.2013 (Annexure P/2) whereby the petitioner has been summoned to face trial in the aforesaid complaint, along with all subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom including the order dated 15.10.2016 (Annexure P/7) declaring the petitioner as a proclaimed person, in view of the facts and circumstances of the case."

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner tried to apprise this court that petitioner was helpless due to various ailments suffered by the petitioner. To that extent communication has been made directly to the District Court by his Doctor. Perusal of such communication it is evident that in order to overcome proclaimed offender order dated 15.10.2016. Having regard to the dates and events all those letters and communications have been made after proclaimed offender order. In view of these facts and circumstances no interference is called for. Accordingly, petition stands dismissed. Dismissal of this petition would not come in the way of petitioner in surrendering before the trial court and seek necessary bail in accordance with law.
