Petitioner Meena Devi has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.28 dated 26.03.2016, registered at Police Station Barara, under Sections 302, 201 and 34 of Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued.

Learned State counsel and learned counsel for the complainant appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record I find that the allegations against the present petitioner is that she had illicit relations with the deceased as well as with the cousin of the deceased. The cause of death in this case is strangulation with the help of pillow. Out of total 23 witnesses, only 6 witnesses have been examined.

The petitioner has been in custody since 28.03.2016. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
