By this petition, FIR No.408 dated 29.12.2015, registered against the petitioner at Police Station Bhondsi, District Gurgaon, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 294 and 506 of the IPC and Section 67-A of the Information Technology Act, 2000, is sought to be quashed, on the basis of a compromise arrived at between the petitioner (accused) and respondent no. 2, i.e. the complainant. A copy of the deed of compromise has been annexed as Annexure P-3 with the petition.

Pursuant to the order of this Court dated 14.09.2016, the report of the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Sohna, has been received, stating therein that the petitioner and respondent no.2, i.e. complainant

the effect that the matter has been amicably settled between them. The statements have also been annexed along with the report, from which it is seen that the complainant has stated that he has no grievance left against the accused and he has no objection if the FIR is quashed.

As per the assessment of the learned Magistrate, the matter has been settled between the parties amicably without any pressure or coercion.

Learned counsel appearing for respondent no.2 does not deny the factum of the compromise reached between the parties.

That being so and looking at the nature of the offences alleged in the FIR, I see no reason to continue with criminal proceedings.

Consequently, the petition is allowed and FIR No.408, dated 29.12.2015, registered against the petitioner at Police Station Bhondsi, District Gurgaon, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 294 and 506 of the IPC and Section 67-A of the Information Technology Act, 2000, along with all proceedings emanating therefrom, is hereby quashed.
