Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that all the co-accused of the petitioner have been acquitted by the learned trial Court vide judgment dated 1.7.2017 (**Annexure P-3**) and thus the petitioner is ready to join the investigation.

On the other hand, learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Jasbir Singh submitted that the petitioner was declared as proclaimed offence on 14.3.2016 by the learned trial Court and as such, he is not entitled for the concession of anticipatory bail.

Heard.

In view of the gravity of the offences i..e under Sections 302,

452, 506, 148 and 149 IPC no case is made out for grant of concession of pre-arrest bail to the petitioner. However, the petitioner is at liberty to surrender before the learned trial Court within seven days from today and if an application for bail is filed the same shall be decided on the next day.

The petition stands disposed of.
