The present petition has been filed under Section 438

Cr.P.C seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No.115 dated 08.10.2016

registered under Sections 302 and 201 read with Section 34 IPC at

Police Station Anandpur Sahib, District Rupnagar.

On 23.10.2017 this Court had passed the following
order:-

“The petitioner is directed to join the investigation.

Post again on 03.11.2017.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest of the petitioner by the
Arresting Officer, she shall be released on interim bail subject
to the following conditions:-

1.That she shall make herself available for interrogation by a
police officer as and when required;

2.That she shall not directly or indirectly make any

inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer and;

3.That she shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.”

It is contended that in pursuance of the order dated 23.10.2017, the petitioner has joined the investigation. She is sister-in-law married in 1989, much prior to the marriage of the deceased and she has nothing to do with the matrimonial life of the deceased and her husband. Even the dead body of the alleged deceased has not been recovered so far. There is no allegation against the petitioner.

Learned State counsel, on instructions, submits that the missing person was last seen in the company of the petitioner.

Considering the fact that the death in the matter has not been yet established as the body of the missing person has not been recovered and the petitioner has repeatedly joined the investigation, therefore, the order dated 23.10.2017 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to furnishing of bail-bonds/surety bonds by the petitioner to the satisfaction of the CJM/Duty Magistrate concerned.

The petition stands allowed.
