Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No. 14 dated 27.01.2018, registered at Police Station Panjokhra, District Ambala, under Section 306 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the allegations in the FIR, the present petitioner blackmailed Vir Devinder Singh (since deceased), husband of complainant and extended threats to him by making phone calls. As per the FIR, an amount of ₹15 lakhs was transferred by Vir

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Devinder Singh (since deceased) from his salary account to the account of father of the present petitioner. Even after that, the petitioner was blackmailing Vir Devinder Singh (since deceased), who committed suicide.

Challan has already been presented. The petitioner has been in custody since 24.02.2018. She is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as she is in judicial custody. The trial of case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to her furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with two sureties in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
