This order shall dispose of CRM-M-36185-2018, filed by petitioners-Aman Kumar and Sanam @ Sagar and CRM-M-38113-2018, filed by petitioners Anand and Bittu @ Bittu Ram, under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.176 dated 29.04.2018, registered at Police Station Butana, Karnal, under Sections 148, 149, 323, 325, 326, 506 and 216 of Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued in both these petitions.

Learned State counsel put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner(s) as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

As per the prosecution version, no specific injury has been

attributed to petitioner-Aman. As regarding, Sanam @ Sagar, he is stated to have given injury on left leg below the joint with iron rod. Petitioner Anand is also stated to have given injury on the right knee with iron rod. Bittu @ Bittu Ram is stated to have given injury on the head with gandasi, which is stated to be blunt. All these injuries attributed to the petitioners are stated to be simple.

The petitioners Aman Kumar, Sanam @ Sagar, Anand and Bittu @ Bittu Ram have been in custody since 28.05.2018, 30.04.2018, 30.04.2018 and 03.05.2018 respectively. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The offences are triable by the Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
