Report dated 30.10.2018 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Ludhiana has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Sandeep Kaur and the accused namely Amarjit Singh, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure. The petitioner as well as the complainant/respondent No.2 have put in appearance in person to vouch this compromise.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, and the fact that the offences for which the accused has been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the settled proposition that compromise will

go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.59 dated 28.04.2016 registered at Police Station Sadar Ludhiana under Sections 354(A), 506 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioner are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
