This is a petition that has been filed under Section 439(2) Cr.P.C. for cancellation of anticipatory bail that has allowed to respondent No.2-Iqbal Singh in FIR No. 118 dated 12.12.2012, under Sections 307, 326, 382, 324, 323, 341, 148, 149, 120-B, 195, 506, 354 of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Lambra, Jalandhar, in Criminal Misc. No.M-30018 of 2017.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondent No.2 argues that Paramjit Lal had earlier filed a Criminal Misc. No.M-19073 of 2013 invoking jurisdiction of this court under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for issuing of

direction to the respondent-State to fairly investigate the matter and arrest the remaining accused in the aforesaid FIR. On notice, a status report was filed, in which it was stated that respondents No.4, 8, 9 and 10 have been declared innocent and the main accused Gurdev Singh, has been found to be an accused, while further stating that a supplementary challan would be filed, after arresting the main accused. In the said order, it was noted that the petitioner would have remedy, after presentation of the challan, to seek prosecution of the other co-accused, in accordance with law.

I have learned counsel for the parties and in view of the fact that the matter has been investigated and a status report has been filed in the petition filed by the petitioner himself and a Coordinate Bench of this court has given liberty to the petitioner to seek prosecution of the other co-accused in accordance with law, no further orders are called for in the instant petition and the same is being disposed of, leaving it open to the petitioner to avail the whatever remedy available to him.

Disposed of in the aforesaid terms accordingly.
