This is a petition that has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C.
for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No. 92 dated
17.08.2017 under Section 498-A IPC, registered at Police Station Women
Sector 17, Chandigarh.

This Court was pleased to pass the following order on
29.09.2017 :-

*“Notice of motion, at this stage with a view to
explore the possibility of an amicable resolution of the
entire dispute between the parties.*

*At this stage, Mr. J.S.Dadwal, Advocate, appears
on behalf of the complainant. Power of attorney filed in
Court today, is taken on record subject to just
exceptions.*

It is submitted that there is a possibility of an

amicable resolution of the entire dispute between the parties.

Accordingly, this matter be placed before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court to explore the possibility of an amicable resolution of the entire dispute between the parties. Parties are directed to appear before the Mediator on 11.10.2017. The petitioner shall hand over a sum of ₹ 20,000/- as travelling/litigation expenses to the complainant before the Mediator on the said date.

List on 08.12.2017 to await the report of the Mediator.

Arrest of the petitioner shall remain stayed till the next date of hearing with a view to explore the possibility of an amicable settlement between the parties.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned counsel for the respondent-State, on instructions from the Investigating Officer confirms the factum of joining investigation by the petitioner.

Since the petitioner has joined the investigation, the petition is allowed and interim order dated 29.09.2017 is hereby made absolute subject to the condition that the petitioner will not tamper with evidence or hamper the investigation; will not leave India without permission of the Court and will comply with the conditions contained in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
