Petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.0138, dated 02.07.2018 under Section 304 IPC, registered at Police Station City Ferozepur.

Heard.

Custody certificate of the petitioner has been filed in the Court today and the same is taken on record.

The allegations against the petitioner are that he supplied intoxicant drugs to one Shivam, who took the over dosage and died. The petitioner was arrested on 02.07.2018. The challan has been presented on 29.08.2018 and the case is pending for trial.

As per custody certificate, the petitioner is in custody for the last two months and nine days. No other case is stated to be pending against the petitioner.

Learned State counsel, on instruction from ASI Sukhchain Singh, states that the evidence against the petitioner is in the statement of the parents of the deceased regarding supply of drugs. However, the said evidence is yet to be considered during trial.

Considering that the disposal of the case will take time and also the fact that there is no similar case pending against the petitioner, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹1,00,000/- with one surety of the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court, subject to such conditions as imposed by the trial Court.
