Report dated 28.09.2018 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Faridabad has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Smt. Ridhima Gupta and the accused persons, namely, Kanishk Gupta, Ravinder Nath Gupta, Rajni Gupta and Yamini Gupta, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offences for which the accused has been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh Vs. State of**

Punjab and another' 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and 'Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No. 536 dated 10.07.2018 registered at Police Station Sector 07, Faridabad under Sections 498-A/406/506 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
