The petitioners pray for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No. 84 dated 08.06.2018, under Sections 452, 324, 323, 506, 148 and 149 of the IPC (Section 326 IPC added later on), registered at Police Station Dharmkot, Moga.

The operative part of the order dated 12.09.2018, vide which the petitioners have been granted interim bail, is reproduced below:

“Counsel for the petitioners has submitted that petitioner No.1 is a young boy aged about 16 years and the only attribution to him is that he has given a dang blow on the thigh of the complainant whereas petitioner No.2 is alleged to have given a lalkara and in the second part of the FIR, it is stated that she has pulled and pushed the wife of the complainant and torn her clothes. It is further submitted that the corresponding injury invoking Section 326 IPC is attributed to other co-accused.

Notice of motion for 03.12.2018.”

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners, in pursuance to the order dated 12.09.2018, have already appeared before the SHO/Investigating Officer and have joined the investigation.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Surjeet Singh, has not disputed the factual position and submits that the petitioners have joined the investigation and are no more required for any further investigation.

In view of the above, the petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioners, vide order dated 12.09.2018, is made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
