As regards the FIR in connection with which the petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail, i.e. FIR No. 21 dated 02.03.2015, registered against him and his co-accused for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 384, 388, 389, 420, 506 and 120-B IPC, it having been shown that the petitioner has compromised the matter with the complainant and notice has also been issued on that basis for quashing of the FIR by this Court in CRM-M-2800 of 2018, the order dated 16.10.2017 passed in this petition, admitting the petitioner to *ad interim* bail in the event of his arrest, is made absolute.

However, it is made absolutely clear that as regards the proceedings initiated against the petitioner under Section 174-A IPC, this Court already having directed him in the previous petition filed by him under Section 438 Cr.P.C, i.e. CRM-M-26804 of 2017, to appear before the trial Court and apply for bail and that fact not having been disclosed to this Court, the proceedings under Section 174-A IPC would continue at the discretion of the trial Court.
