The petitioner seeks regular bail in case FIR No.97 dated 5.4.2017, registered at Police Station City Barnala, District Barnala, under Sections 420, 419, 467, 468, 471, 120-B, 201 IPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been in custody since 24.09.2017. The trial is not likely to be concluded at an early date as out of 45 PWs only 33 PWs have been examined till date. The only allegation against the petitioner is that he identified the impersonator as the owner of the property in dispute. Thus, the petitioner may be released on regular bail.

The prayer is opposed by learned State counsel as well as counsel for the complainant. It is submitted that there are 02 other FIRs registered against the petitioner, in which identical allegations have been made against him. It is, therefore, likely that the petitioner may abscond in case he is granted regular bail or try to influence the witnesses.

In rejoinder, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that all the private witnesses stand examined. Thus, there is no possibility of interference with the trial.

Keeping in view the fact that the petitioner has been in custody for the last one year and six months approximately and that the trial may not be concluded at an early date, no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner in custody indefinitely. Moreover, all the private witnesses have been examined and thus, there is no possibility of interference with the trial. Accordingly, I deem it appropriate to allow this petition. The petition is allowed and petitioner-Gurvinder Singh, is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court concerned.
