Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.16 dated 18.01.2017, registered at Police Station Nissing, District Karnal, under Sections 148, 149, 323, 325, 285, 506, 307 and 379-B of IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and complainant has also appeared through his counsel. They have contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

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Perusal of record shows that firstly, no injury has been declared dangerous to life, rather simple injuries with blunt weapon have been caused. There is no fire-arm injury in the present case. No injury has been attributed to the present petitioner.

Learned State counsel as well as learned counsel for complainant submits that the petitioner was also declared a proclaimed offender.

The petitioner has been in custody since 24.07.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case may take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with two sureties in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
