ANITA CHAUDHRY, J

This is the second application filed by the petitioner seeking regular bail in case FIR No.83 dated 02.07.2017 registered under Sections 306-B and 34 IPC. Later on Section 304-B IPC was added at Police Station Amargarh District Sangrur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the first bail application of the petitioner was dismissed in June, 2018 and the petitioner is in custody since 04.07.2017 and the trial is delayed and his custody is long.

State counsel informs that the first application was dismissed on merits as the accusations against the petitioner were that he was having illicit relations with his sister-in-law and his wife set herself on fire

disturbed with his relationship. The State counsel further informs that out of 13 witnesses 8 witnesses have been examined and 3 witnesses have been given up and 2 witnesses only remain to be examined and the case is fixed for 28.09.2018.

The bail application filed by the petitioner on merits had been dismissed in June, 2018. The trial is proceeding at a fast pace. Only 2 witnesses remain to be examined.

Considering the allegations, no case for bail is made out. However, directions are given to the trial Court to complete the trial expeditiously and if possible within a period of 04 months from the next date fixed in the trial Court.

Defence would not seek unnecessary adjournments or delay the trial.
