GURVINDER SINGH GILL, J.(Oral)

By way of filing this petition, the petitioner seeks quashing of FIR No.58 dated 1.6.2015 registered under Sections 66-C and 66-D of Information Technology Act, 2000 at Police Station Rahon, District SBS Nagar and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom on the basis of a compromise having been effected between the parties.

Vide order dated 2.11.2017, the parties had been directed to appear before the trial Court so as to get their statements recorded qua the factum of compromise.

Report of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Shaheed Bhagat Singh Nagar has been received, wherein it has been reported that the statements of the complainant Kashmir Singh and also of the accused/petitioner Sharanpreet Singh have been recorded to the effect that they have compromised the matter amongst themselves with the intervention

of respectables. It has specifically been opined that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily and without there being any pressure, coercion or undue influence.

In view of the aforesaid compromise and bearing in mind the law laid down by Full Bench of this Court in 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052 Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab, the present petition is allowed and FIR No.58 dated 1.6.2015 registered under Sections 66-C and 66-D of Information Technology Act, 2000 at Police Station Rahon, District SBS Nagar and all the consequent proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed qua the petitioner.
