Petitioner Rakesh Kumar @ Dana has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.87 dated 19.05.2017, registered at Police Station Division No.2, Pathankot, under Sections 379, 411, 420, 467, 468, 471 and 472 of IPC.

Notice of motion has been issued.

Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

The FIR in the present case has been registered on the statement of complainant-Vikas Dutta. As per the allegation, he had parked his motor cycle in front of his shop, which was stolen. Later on, when the motor cycle was got recovered, it was having forged number plate.

The petitioner has been in custody since 21.05.2017. He is not

required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
