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DAYA CHAUDHARY, J. (Oral)

This petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for quashing of FIR No.0065 dated 06.08.2016 under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station Begowal, Distt. Kapurthala, on the basis of compromise.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that a compromise has been arrived at between the parties and thereafter, statements of the parties were recorded before the Judicial Magistrate First Class, Kapurthala, wherein factum of compromise has been affirmed.

After recording statements of the parties, a report has also been sent to this Court which is on record, wherein it has been mentioned that as per the statements of complainant Rawel Singh, accused Davinder Singh

Bhullar and Shashi Bala, a compromise has been arrived between them with the intervention of the respectables, which is without any pressure, coercion or undue influence. The parties were identified while making their statements.

Learned counsel for the complainant has also affirmed the factum of compromise arrived between the parties.

The matter has been sorted out between the parties because of the compromise and the complainant has no objection in quashing of the FIR. The compromise is genuine and without any pressure, coercion or undue influence from either side. The report in this regard has also been sent by learned Judicial Magistrate First Class, Kapurthala, before whom their statements were recorded. The report is also on record. The dispute between the parties has amicably been settled and complainant is not interested in pursuing the litigation.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and FIR No.0065 dated 06.08.2016 under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B IPC registered at Police Station Begowal, Distt. Kapurthala and other proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed.
