SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioners, who are the accused in F.I.R. No.147, dated 20.10.2012, under Sections 148, 149, 323, 325 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Radaur, District Yamunanagar, have prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings on the basis of compromise.

[2]. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, respondent No.2 has arrived at a settlement with the accused vide Compromise (Annexure P-3) which is duly signed by her. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to

report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhri, vide report dated 02.01.2018, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

[3]. Respondent No. 2 is represented by her counsel and she does not oppose the compromise.

[4]. In view of the report of the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhri, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in "*Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another*", **2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and "*Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another*", **(2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has herself compromised the dispute with the petitioners/accused persons.

[5]. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R. No.147, dated 20.10.2012, under Sections 148, 149, 323, 325 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Radaur, District Yamunanagar, and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise qua the present petitioners.
