Main case

The instant petition has been filed under Section 438 of
Cr.P.C., for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner, who has been
summoned to face trial under Sections 323, 354, 506, 120-B of Indian Penal
Code in Criminal Complaint No.38 dated 16.04.2015 titled as “*Raghubir*

Singh vs. Jaswant Singh & ors.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that pursuant to the order dated 21.11.2017 passed by this court, the petitioner has surrendered before the trial court and furnished the requisite bail bonds and surety bonds.

Learned counsel for respondent No.1 does not dispute this fact, however, he opposes the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the facts that pursuant to the directions given by this court, the petitioner has appeared before the trial court and furnished the requisite bail bonds and surety bonds, without commenting on the merits of the case, the petition is allowed and order dated 21.11.2017 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 Sub Section 2 Clauses (i)(ii) and (iii) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
