The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for issuance of appropriate direction to learned trial Court to conclude the trial within four months of the case bearing FIR No.03 dated 16.01.2013 registered under Sections 307/34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25 of the Arms Act at Police Station Mehal Kalan, District Barnala.

Learned State counsel has filed reply by way of affidavit of Jasbir Singh PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub Division, Mehal Kalan on behalf of respondent-State in the Court today. The same is taken on record. Copy supplied to the opposite side.

Perusal of the preliminary submissions of paragraph 2 of the affidavit reveals that there are total 16 PW's in this case and out of them 6 have been examined and 6 have been given up by the prosecution and only 4 Pw's are yet to be examined and the case is

fixed for prosecution evidence on 05.04.2018. Admittedly, the petitioner is on bail in the FIR No.03, dated 16.01.2013 and trial is going on in routine.

In view of the above, there are no exceptional circumstances shown to issue any directions to learned trial Court in the present case and thus the same is dismissed.
