SUDIP AHLUWALIA J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioners, who are the accused persons in F.I.R No.539, dated 29.07.2015, under Sections 323/324/325/341/506/34 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Ballabgarh City, District Faridabad (Annexure P-1), have prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings, on the basis of compromise.

[2]. During pendency of petition, the complainant has arrived at a settlement with the accused vide Compromise Deed dated 15.11.2017 (Annexure P-2), which is duly signed by him. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Judicial Magistrate First Class, Faridabad, vide report dated 19.12.2017 has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

[3]. In view of the report of the Judicial Magistrate First Class, Faridabad and in view of the decisions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **“Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and **“Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioners/accused persons.

[4]. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R No.539, dated 29.07.2015, under Sections 323/324/325/341/506/34 IPC , registered at Police Station Ballabgarh City, District Faridabad (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed qua the present petitioners.
