Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.117 dated 07.12.2017, registered at Police Station Dera Baba Nanak, Police District Batala, District Gurdaspur, under Sections 326, 324, 323, 506, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of respondent-State and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

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From the record, I find that the present petitioner is named in the FIR. He is stated to be armed with *datar* and has caused injury on the head of Jarnail Singh. The said injury has been declared simple in nature. The present petitioner is not the main accused.

Furthermore, learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned counsel for the complainant admits that compromise has already been effected between the parties.

The petitioner has been in custody since 03.05.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
