The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking a direction to respondents 2 to 4 for registration of a criminal case against respondents 5 and 6 for trespassing at the night time and outraging the modesty of the petitioner.

It is contended that the petitioner is married to one Vishal. Respondent No. 6—Harpreet Singh had bad eye on the petitioner since her husband was employed in a foreign country. On 7.9.2018 at about 11 p.m., respondent No. 6 trespassed into the house of the petitioner as her husband had gone outside and committed certain theft of valuables/goods. In this regard, the petitioner made a representation dated 20.9.2018 to respondent No.2, but no action has been taken thereon.

Notice of motion to the official respondents.

At this stage, on the asking of the court Ms. Rajni Gupta, Sr.

DAG Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents and submits that official respondents will look into the matter and will decide the representation of the petitioners within a period of six weeks, on receipt of certified copy of this order. Let sufficient number of copies of the paper book be supplied to her during the course of the day.

In view of the above, I dispose of the instant petition by directing the official respondents to decide the representation dated 20.9.2018 (Annexure P-1) of the petitioner within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order, in accordance with law.

The petition stands disposed of in the above-said terms.
