In this petition, the petitioner, who is the accused person in F.I.R No.86, dated 18.07.2016, under Sections 279, 337 and 427 of the Indian Penal Code (for short "IPC") subsequently added Section 338 of IPC, registered at Police Station Mataur District SAS Nagar (Annexure P-1), has prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise.

2. Now the complainant has arrived at a settlement with the accused/s vide Compromise Deed (Annexure P-2), which is duly signed by him. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Ld. Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, SAS Nagar Mohali, vide report dated 13.12.2017 has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

3. None has appeared on behalf of the complainant/respondent No.2 which itself shows that he has no objection to the quashing of FIR.

4. In view of the report of the Ld. Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, SAS Nagar Mohali, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in “Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and “Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant/respondent No.2 has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioner/accused person.

5. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R No.86, dated 18.07.2016, under Sections 279, 337 and 427 of IPC, subsequently added Section 338 of IPC registered at Police Station Mataur District SAS Nagar (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed *qua* the present petitioner.
