Petitioner Manjit Kaur @ Manju has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.115 dated 12.09.2017, registered at Police Station Julkan, Patiala, under Sections 302, 323, 148 and 149 of IPC.

Notice of motion has been issued.

Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that though the present petitioner is named in the FIR, yet no specific injury has been attributed to her. Only allegation against her is that she along with Paramjit Kaur and 5/6 other unidentified persons had given beatings to complainant-Harneek Singh, when he was running from the spot. Co-accused Paramjit Kaur has already been granted bail by the Co-ordinate Bench.

required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as she is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping her in custody till the final disposal of the case. Even otherwise, on the ground of parity, she is entitled to bail.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to her furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
