RAJ SHEKHAR ATTRI, J.(ORAL)

Petitioner has preferred the instant petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.34 dated 15.04.2016, registered under Sections 420, 506 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station Chhabewal, Hoshiarpur.

It is a case of the prosecution that complainant-Didar Singh had sold goods to the petitioner and his associate. In lieu of that, Deepak Arora as well as Mani @ Harsh had to pay a sum of Rs.2,13,000/-. However, they had handed over the cheque of Rs.2,13,000/- dated 13.11.2014 of State Bank of India, Civil Line Jalandhar duly signed by defendant No.3 to the complainant to collect the money. The cheque was of firm Ambika Concest Pvt. Ltd. upon which petitioner had put his signatures. The firm also reported to be of the petitioner. Complainant presented the cheque for payment and it was informed that the petitioner has already closed the bank account.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that it is purely case of civil nature whereas, learned counsel for the complainant vehemently contended that it is a case of cheating.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and given thoughtful considerations to the rival submissions of the parties.

Learned State counsel on instructions from SI Sarabjit Singh submitted that petitioner has joined investigation and nothing is to be recovered from him. Civil matter is also pending.

In the circumstances, without going into the merits of the case, I do not deem it appropriate to deny the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in the present case. Ordered accordingly.

Resultantly, the interim order dated 27.11.2017, passed by this court, is made absolute subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands allowed.
