FATEH DEEP SINGH, J.

This order shall dispose off regular bail application under Section 439 Cr.P.C of the petitioners Lovepreet Singh and Inderpreet Singh filed in case FIR No.264 dated 09.09.2018 under Sections 323,341,354,506,34 IPC and Section 185 of Motor Vehicle Act, 1954 Police Station, Sector 19, Chandigarh.

The brief facts brought to the notice of the Court are that; on 09.09.2018 when the complainant Sushant along with his family was coming on his Innova vehicle and when they reached at intersection of Sectors 19-27, Chandigarh it is alleged that three cars were being driven in a zigzag manner and while they were in the process of overtaking them, a scuffle ensued leading to registration of the present case.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioner Lovepreet Singh was arrested on the same very day and the

petitioner Inderpreet Singh was arrested on the next day and that they are behind the bars from the last one month and that the allegations are not of serious in nature and the trial is not likely to be concluded in near future.

Learned State counsel has opposed the grant of bail to the petitioners on the ground of being a case of road rage which is quite prevalent in this city.

Appreciating the submissions of the two sides, admittedly the petitioners have not been hauled up for any heinous offence and they are behind the bars since almost more than one and half months and that the trial is not likely to be concluded in near future. That culpability, if any, shall be determined at the time of trial and no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioners behind the bars, without adverting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition for grant of regular bail is allowed. Petitioners be admitted to bail to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
