In the present petition, petitioners seek anticipatory bail under the provision of Section 438 Cr.P.C. in FIR No.218 dated 13.10.2017 under Sections 420 IPC, registered at Police Station Sector 26, Chandigarh.

2. This Court vide order dated 28.03.2018 had directed the petitioners to join investigation and in the event of their arrest, they were ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

3. Learned State counsel, on instructions states that in pursuance to the order dated 28.03.2018 the petitioner has joined investigation. That apart observations made by this court in the order dated 28.03.2018 have gone un rebutted.

4. In view of these factual aspect and circumstances, without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, the order dated 28.03.2018,

granting ad-interim bail to the petitioner, is hereby made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

5. However, the petitioner shall not in any way indulge in any criminal activities and he shall also not influence the witnesses or other wise interfere with the fair trial. This order would not come in the way of his custodial interrogation in any other matter.

6. Accordingly, the petition stands allowed.
