SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioner, who is the accused in F.I.R No.0032 dated 11th May, 2017, under Sections 323, 324 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Kotwali Nabha, District Patiala (Annexure P-1), have prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings pending therefrom, on the basis of compromise.

2. Now the complainant/respondent No.2 has arrived at a settlement with the accused vide Compromise Deed (Annexure P-2), which is duly signed by him. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Ld. Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Nabha, vide report dated 14th December,

2017 has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

3. Respondents No. 2 is represented by his counsel and does not dispute the factum of compromise.

4. In view of the report of the Ld. Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Nabha, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in “Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and “Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioner/accused.

5. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R No.0032 dated 11th May, 2017, under Sections 323, 324 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Kotwali Nabha, District Patiala (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed *qua* the present petitioner.
