By this petition, FIR No.602 dated 07.11.2017, registered against the petitioner at Police Station Sector-5, District Panchkula, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 279 and 336 IPC, is sought to be quashed on the basis of a compromise arrived at between the petitioner-accused and respondent no.2, i.e. the complainant.

Vide an order of this Court dated 05.12.2017, the parties were directed to appear before the learned trial Court to get their statements recorded, in terms of the compromise reached between them.

Pursuant to the aforesaid order, the report of the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Panchkula, has been sent to this Court, in which it is stated that the petitioner, Deepak Jagota, as also respondent no.2, Vikram Parkash, appeared before that Court and stated to the effect that they have

entered into a compromise, with no dispute pending between them. As per the assessment of the learned Magistrate, the compromise arrived at between the parties is of their free will and without any kind of pressure or coercion.

In view of the above and keeping in view the ratio of the law laid down by the hon'ble Supreme Court in **Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303**, in the opinion of this Court, it would be pointless to continue with criminal proceedings, the parties having fully compromised the matter of their own free will, with the offences alleged being related to a motor accident, in which injuries were received.

Consequently, the petition is allowed and FIR No.602 dated 07.11.2017, registered against the petitioner at Police Station Sector-5, District Panchkula, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 279 and 336 IPC, along with all proceedings emanating therefrom, is hereby quashed.
