SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioner, who is an accused in F.I.R. No.274, dated 22.05.2017, under Sections 65/66 and 67 of the Information and Technology Act, 2000, (now added Sections 153-A and 295-A of the Indian Penal Code), registered at Police Station City Sonapat, (Annexure P-1), has prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings on the basis of compromise.

[2]. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, respondent No.2 has arrived at a settlement with the accused vide Compromise Deed (Annexure P-2) which is duly signed by him. The

matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Chief Judicial Magistrate, Sonapat, vide report dated 22.12.2017, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

[3]. Respondent No. 2 is represented by his counsel and he does not oppose the compromise.

[4]. In view of the report of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Sonapat, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in “Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and “Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioner/accused.

[5]. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R. No.274, dated 22.05.2017, under Sections 65/66 and 67 of the Information and Technology Act, 2000, (now added Sections 153-A and 295-A of the Indian Penal Code), registered at Police Station City Sonapat, (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise qua the present petitioner.
