Petitioners-Narender Singh and Samay Singh have filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.12 dated 24.08.2018, registered at Police Station SVB Faridabad, under Sections 7, 8 and 13 of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 (challan presented under Section 7 of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 and Sections 201 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code).

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

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From the record, I find that allegations against the present petitioners are that they were demanding bribe from the truck owners and thereafter, a trap was laid and ₹10,000/- is stated to be paid to petitioner No.2-Samay Singh whereas petitioner No.1-Narender Singh was not present at that time. Petitioner No.2-Samay Singh is stated to have gone on motor-cycle and nothing has been recovered from him, rather recovery has been effected from the drawer of owner of service-station.

Challan has already been presented. The petitioners have been in custody since 25.08.2018. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
