JAISHREE THAKUR, J. (ORAL)

This is a petition that has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.48 dated 22.08.2018 under Sections 354-D, 506 IPC and Section 67 of I.T. Act, 2000, registered at Women Police Station, Hisar, District Hisar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner herein has been into custody in the aforesaid FIR since 08.09.2018. It is submitted that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case. It is also contended that the matter has been investigated and the challan has been presented. He further submits that conclusion of trial will take

sufficient time, therefore, the petitioner is entitled to be enlarged on bail.

Per contra, learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondent State, on instructions from the Investigating Officer, oppose the grant of regular bail to the petitioner, while submitting that offences alleged against the petitioner are serious in nature, however, she does not dispute the fact that the matter has been investigated and the challan has been presented.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Since, the matter has been investigated; the challan has been presented; the trial is likely to take some time and in view of the fact that that the petitioner herein has been in custody since 08.09.2018, no useful purpose would be served in keeping the petitioner behind bars. At this stage, without commenting on the merits of the case, the instant petition is allowed and the petitioner is directed to be released on regular bail on execution of adequate personal bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of concerned trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
