This order shall dispose of the aforementioned four petitions as these connected petitions have been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C praying for the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners herein in case F.I.R. No.145 dated 06.11.2017 under sections 186, 353, 332, 148, 149 I.P.C, registered at Police Station, Dhariwal, District Gurdaspur.

Counsel for the parties have been heard.

FIR came to be registered on the statement of ASI Gurbachan Singh. As per prosecution version, secret information having been received

by the police party as regards Manish @ Messy son of Inayat Masih having stored liquor at his shop and waiting for customers, raid was conducted. Precise allegations are that at that point of time the accused/petitioners herein had obstructed the police party. Amarbir Singh @ Babba Gill i.e. petitioner in CRM-M-46476-2017 is stated to have hurled an empty glass bottle and which landed on the right hand and shoulder of HC Jaspal Singh, who was a member of the police party.

During the course of hearing learned State counsel has furnished for perusal of this Court the MLR of HC Jaspal Singh and which records the police official concerned complaining of pain in his right shoulder.

No other injury has been noticed on the person of HC Jaspal Singh or any other member of the police party.

In each of these connected four petitions, while issuing notice of motion the petitioners were directed to join investigation and were granted ad interim protection as regards arrest.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from ASI Ranjit Singh would apprise the Court that the petitioners has since joined investigation and there is no recovery i.e. to be effected from them.

Accordingly, prayer made in these four petitions is accepted. Orders dated 7.12.2017 passed in CRM-M-46476-2017, 13.12.2017 passed in CRM-M-47392-2017, 6.3.2018 passed in CRM-M-9058-2018 and 8.3.2018 passed in CRM-M-9730-2018, are made absolute.

Petitions disposed of.
