Custody certificate dated 25.5.2018 filed in Court today and the same is taken on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner presses the petition only on the quantum of sentence.

Heard.

The petitioner was convicted under Sections 419, 467, 468, 471 read with Section 120B IPC vide judgment of conviction and order of sentence dated 19.10.2010 passed by learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Faridabad and sentenced as under:-

Appeal qua the petitioner was dismissed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Faridabad vide order dated 12.9.2012.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner was witness in a sale deed and that he is not the beneficiary. Seller and the beneficiary have been sentenced to the period already undergone.

However, learned State counsel informs that in their case, their undergone period was about two years.

Considering the facts and circumstances and the role attributed to the petitioner, sentence of the petitioner under Section 467, 468 and 471 read with Section 120-B IPC is reduced from Rigorous Imprisonment for two years to Rigorous Imprisonment for one year. Remaining part of the sentence in said Sections and other Section is maintained.

With the above noted modification, the present revision petition is dismissed.
