INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for brevity, 'Cr.P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.56 dated 06.03.2018, registered at Police Station Naraingarh, Ambala, under Sections 323, 324, 506 and 34 of IPC and Section 326 of IPC added later on.

Notice of motion was issued in this case. Learned State counsel has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that the present petitioner is stated to have been armed with knife and gave knife blows on stomach, chest, back etc. of the injured. The knife has already been got recovered by the present petitioner after his arrest.

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Perusal of the record shows that earlier, the petitioner has been released on regular bail under Section 323, 324 and 506 of IPC and now Section 326 of IPC has been added. Perusal of record further shows that the present petitioner gave six injuries with knife, out of which five injuries have been opined to be grievous in nature.

Keeping in view the above facts, no ground is made out for grant of anticipatory bail to the present petitioner.

Therefore, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
