SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioners, who are the accused persons in F.I.R No.166, dated 20th July, 2014, under Sections 323/324/506/34 of the Indian Penal Code (for short 'the IPC) and Section 326 of the IPC (added later on), registered at Police Station Gharinda, District Amritsar Rural (Annexure P-1), have prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings pending therefrom, on the basis of compromise.

2. Now the complainant/respondent No.2 has arrived at a settlement with the accused persons vide Compromise Deed (Annexure P-2), which is duly signed by him. The matter was referred to the Ld. Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Ld. Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Amritsar, vide report dated

14th March, 2018 has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

3. Respondents No.2 is represented by his counsel and does not dispute the factum of compromise.

4. In view of the report of the Ld. Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Amritsar, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **“Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and **“Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioners/accused persons.

5. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R No.166, dated 20th July, 2014, under Sections 323/324/506/34 of the IPC and Section 326 of the IPC (added later on), registered at Police Station Gharinda, District Amritsar Rural (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed *qua* the present petitioners.
