Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for issuance of directions to the respondents No.2 and 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of private respondents No.4 to 6.

The petitioners have approached this Court for the aforesaid protection on the ground that they have solemnized marriage against the wishes of private respondents. However, the documents attached with the petition nowhere even remotely suggest that the petitioners are residing within the territorial jurisdiction of this Court. The petitioners have placed reliance upon the affidavit of one Nagender Paswan son of Mukh Lal Paswan, resident of House No.404, Gobind Nagar, Naya Gaon, District SAS Nagar, Mohali, wherein he has deposed that he is paternal uncle of petitioner No.1, who has been living along with him since the year 2010 on the aforesaid

address. However, the petitioners have not placed on record any document or evidence, namely, Aadhar Card, driving licence, ration card, voter list etc. showing that they are residing within the territorial jurisdiction of this Court. Thus, in the absence of any such document or evidence, this Court finds that the affidavit of Nagender Paswan is nothing but an attempt to invoke territorial jurisdiction of this Court.

The present petition is, accordingly, dismissed.
